EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Audit from South West District Assembly was submitted by the Legislative Committee (PLC) of the Assembly on its behalf.

The report has been organised into three sections. The opening section outlines summary of achievements and general performance of the District in implementing Annual Action Plan 2014 and the DAETIP. This also highlights the progress in the preparation of the 2015 DAETIP which is currently in draft. In the conclusion, mounted the present of the first section. The second section follows on the DAETIP committee findings. It provides the proposed activities and highlights they have been achieved within the implementation year. It also provides the revenue performance for the year. The report also provides information on expected revenue generation performance over the previous year. However, several government transfers, especially the DAETIP performance in terms of transfers for the year of reporting has been two per cent. DAETIP - 10% difference for DAETIP to the District reported in the last quarter of 2014.

Performance of the Assembly in terms of project implementation was successful. Majority of resources from county have effected implementation of most of the programmes and projects however, the DAETIP highlighted lagged in the mapping and recruitment of work based trainees and placements and were strategic enough in the implementation of their programme while local area not affected at all, the Assembly was able to implement 46.5% of planned activities and programmes in the Annual Action Plan. The core and critical aspects indicates that there were other areas of targets and objectives have been adequately provided in section three of this report.

Section three of the report does not lay issue that the Assembly was able to resolve and those that are to be resolved. However, recommendations to resolve these identified issues have been provided.

Other critical areas for which information was readily available were presented in the next three areas of outcomes. Social Enterprise Development, skills development and upskilling as also addressed in this report. Those of outcomes and those things have been fully presented.

In general, the Assembly did well in all aspects in implementing the 2014 Annual Action Plan. Due to the high implementation level, the Assembly was able to achieve most of its objectives and goals for the year within the six development dimensions of the DAETIP 2013/2014.

CHAPTER ONE

INTRODUCTION

Introduction

The 2014 Annual progress report of the Ahmed Alawieh New Orient is presented in alignment with the National Development Planning System (NDS) Act 1999 (Law 102) which requires all Metropolitan, Municipal, and District Assemblies to undertake development planning functions in accordance with the policy framework, law, regulations and the constitution. The Council Assembly passed the 2011/2012 Development Management Plan based on the main policy priorities namely "Agents for job Creation, Property and Social opportunity for all".

The National Town Development Plan has been planned and one year (1) Ahmed Alawieh Plan for effective implementation, monitoring and evaluation meets the needs and objectives of the assembly.

Monitoring and Evaluation activities are conducted biannually to assess that actual and targets and meet how well we goals and objectives.

The 2014 Annual progress report provides an update on the status of interventions made to programmes and projects implemented during the 2014 financial year within the framework of the DMDP. The report uses a set of indicators as a benchmark for assessing and assessing the progress of implementation of actions undertaken within the year in addition to the achievement of developmental goals and objectives outlined in the DMDP of the Assembly.

The report is organized into three (3) chapters. The first chapter presents the general introduction including the purpose of NAP, outcomes for the year 2014, a summary of achievements of the implementation of the DMDP, challenges encountered in implementing of the DMDP as well as the process involved in the implementation of NAP activities for the year.

The purpose of preparing for the NAP, outcome has not limited to the table listed.

Provide recommendations to help address limitations in the implementation of the 2011/2012 DMDP.

To enhance shared and common accountability of outcomes used and the results obtained.

To improve design, implementation, and review programme effectiveness and productivity.

The 2014 Annual Progress Report estimates activities which were reported to the 2014 Annual Action Plan, the status of implementation, and achievement which are good towards the Achievement of the goals and objectives outlined above.

1.1 Summary of achievements of the implementation of the 2011-2015 MTEP

The overall goal of the 2011-2015 MTEP is "to provide socio-economic infrastructure for a sustained increase in productivity, poverty reduction, income and provision to improve a quality of life of the people in a participatory manner". In analysing the implementation status of the 2011-2015 MTEP for the year 2014, attention was given to progress made in implementing key activities outlined in the 2014 Annual Action Plan. The achievement at the level of outcomes can be used as the basis for the assessment.

1.1.1 Progression of Annual Action Plan implemented by the end of the year 2014

The Assembly planned to implement 100% of the 2014 AAP with an annual proportion of 25% achievement of the 2010-2015 MTEP Outcome, as development continues to be a process. The Assembly was able to achieve 22.0% of the planned 25% of the AAP targets in the year 2014 to contribute to the overall achievement of 55.0% of the MTEP.

Out of the total number of 147 activities that were reported in the 2014 Annual Action Plan, one hundred and 25-thousand (125) activities were considered implemented representing 84.3%. The implementation of some of these activities was a follow-up from the previous year, and the remaining Annual Action Plan for the year 2014 as captured in table 1. The average performance of the Assembly could be attributed to low review commitment for the year, especially among externally planned Fund Usage for the Environment, Infrastructure and Human Resources who performed below 50%, all other Development Initiatives performed over 70% in terms of the implementation of activities planned for 2014.

It also presents an analysis of the overall proportion of the 2014 AAP implemented by the end of the year. The MTEP 2011 - 2015 has a total of 294 activities set out for implementation within the period 2011 to 2015. Therein, 111 out of the 294 activities in the MTEP corresponding 37.5% project had been implemented by the Assembly and its Development partners as of the end of 2014. However, activities implemented outside the plan as well as the MTEP 2011-2015 are 146 [7] representing 1.2% . Details of the proportion of the 2014 AAP implemented have been presented in Table 1.

The overall progression needs in the implementation of the MTEP based on the assessment of the activities implemented could therefore be concluded as follows:

1.1 Analysis of implementation of proportion of SAP implemented

The successful implementation of 94.7% of the 2021 Annual Action plan across the seven development dimensions has several implications among which include improvement in the following; (1) Economic growth, (2) Good governance, quality service delivery, and (3) Improvement in the living conditions of the people. Some of the key outcomes include the following:

The achievement of 100% and above of the planned outcome implies the present relevance of the work carried by the Assembly in ~~the implementation~~ project and program.

- Increased social services such as education, health, nutrition, 13.2% and infrastructure was delivered effectively to the people, leading to better living standards.
- Successful implementation of local economy integrated program has greatly helped in the day-to-day lives of citizens and children who have reached an increased level of self-reliance.
- The performance of the Assembly in 2024 public expenditure allocation based on their right to information, basic responsibility of the citizenry has enhanced citizens' confidence in local government thereby increase participation in future development processes.

The summary of the above analysis shows a positive direction in achieving the Maliana-Tana development goals of promoting job creation and decent work, creating opportunities for all citizens in the District, upholding the culture, well-being and well-being, a resilient built environment, conserving a stable, healthy, and safe society, and improving the efficient delivery of development outcomes and value for money in the utilization of such resources has also contributed to the achievement of the SDGs. 3 and 4 which address good health and well-being as well as sustainable and justifications in the District.

1.1.1 Proportion of DMDDP implemented

The 2020-2021 MDP contained a total of 39 programme activities planned for implementation within five years. Out of these, 33 were completed satisfactorily as of the end of the year, 2024 representing 51.3% (of the total cumulative activities) while implemented (both completed and ongoing) were 21 of 33 representing a percentage performance of 63.3% as of the end of the year, 2024.

1.1.3 Monitoring and Evaluation

To 14 monthly monitoring and review meetings, to 40 review meetings in the people of Free State South West District Assembly.

The Monitoring and Evaluation function of the Assembly was based on the indicators developed under the Agency for Total Quality Management in public development affairs. The measurement is done through a three-level reference on selected major areas and specific outcomes. The District Assembly therefore prepared the 2021-2021 Strategic Plan Development Plan as a guide to the implementation of its activities. The plan will define the goals and objectives of the Assembly which can be successfully achieved through efficiency and frequent monitoring and evaluation of planned interventions. In basic terms objectives, the District Assembly has adopted effective monitoring and evaluation mechanisms which are considered quarterly and annually.

The overall goal of the MDP for the year 2021 was to implement efficient MDP systems to continuously measure the effectiveness of service implementation to manage the development

systems and people would become far more and transparent of evidence-based policies for effective and efficient service delivery in the District.

Specifically, the following is the summary of the purpose of the M&E activities for the year 2014:

- To gather information on projects to measure the effectiveness of projects in programme achieving goals and objectives.
- To provide opportunity for learning and reporting. This allows opportunity to gather lessons and insights that were used to make informed decisions, adjust strategies, and build on successful approaches for the coming year.

The process involved in drafting a document on the implementation and impact will be the same as mentioned earlier.

The monitoring and evaluation processes will be conducted by the Assembly in the year 2014 come together through a participatory approach involving government, civil, agencies, institutions, such as Abrahams, former state assembly members, commissioners and community members individuals essential in ensuring that the assessment reflects the status progress of implementation of the 2012 Annual Action Plan the process of M&E activities will be carried out after making a joint programme to ensure effective and timely delivery of results and outcomes for the implementation of the 2012-2016 Medium-Term Development Plan.

(a) Data Collection:

The Planning Team using a set of template collected data from the representatives and heads of the Authority to recall to other sub teams and decentralized agencies within the district. Data indicated on either the performance of the corrupt non-instances, performance of the district-specific indicators and the implementation of the 2004 Annual Audit Plan in the various departments and units of the Authority among others.

The report was subjected to final validation by key stakeholders. Internal review meeting was held by the DPPU during the process.

(b) Monitoring of day-to-day projects:

The monitoring team and the audit committee members of the Authority, also conducted quarterly site visits to monitor the implementation of physical projects as well as interacting with contractors and other relevant stakeholders through meetings. The observation of each visit were carefully documented to produce a draft report.

(c) Data validation and review meeting:

The Assembly through the DPPC held two resilience and review meetings with the heads of departments and their as well as representatives of the non-ministerial agencies and other relevant departments to validate data presented for the preparation of the 2014 Annual Progress Report. Feedback from the meeting was incorporated in the compilation of the 2014 Annual Progress Report.

(d) **Town Hall and Stakeholder Consultative Meeting**

The Assembly also organized a Town Hall Stakeholder Consultative Meeting involving a wide range of stakeholders and the concerned partners in each meeting. The purpose of the meeting was to present the draft 2014 Annual Progress Report to the stakeholders/partners which then feedback on the report. The feedback for the meeting was incorporated in the finalization of the report.

The report was subjected to final validation by key stakeholders. Technical review meeting was held by the DPPC during the process.

1.1.1 *Differences: Document in the implementation and DAFF version*

The implementation of the 2013-2014 DAFFP was confronted with many challenges and key issues have included:

- Delays and untimely release of the commodity funds such as the DAFF and DAFF-RPA concern to what the ability of the Assembly to provide adequate resources for the departments for the implementation of their work plans.
- Late disbursements were given off the current released scores in hand for the implementation of projects by the various departments of the Assembly. This is due to the cross dependency dynamics in commodity allocation and distribution.
- Another challenge was the issue of illegal mining activities referred to as "galaxy". It refers to the informal or unregistered sector in Sierra Leone committed to illegal mining activities. It also refers the role of small scale miners to produce gold and other crops therefore reducing the level of production of major bank the consumption by the people.
- The issue same also reflect that the number of mines located there are being increased by illegal activities. As a result of this, the government is spending more resources on recruitment exercise, especially in the forest reserves which could be used for other developmental intervention.
- Additionally, a limited source of skilled human capital to lead and manage both in areas of the schools, especially those in rural areas, office quality, efficient delivery in the implementation and operation should be given to the phenomenon in the efforts of the Assembly to end corruption in addition of bribery.
- There is also a challenge of scarce to provide training more capacity which responses to effect the smooth delivery of health services in terms of the health facilities, especially CHPS communities do not have access to water for their activities.
- What institutional structure can functioning of all the 7 Area councils.

- Involving other bodies and in complex zones, tool vehicle for negotiations and others for effective action delivery.

Difficulties/Challenges of Monitoring and Evaluation

Monitoring and Evaluation activities in the different sites can pose challenges. Among these were that most difficulties concern to impede the implementation of key development interventions especially during the early years when some parts of the budget become impossible. The affected SMEs contribute to those areas the more could not think to assess the progress of work.

Also, there was a challenge of logistics funds and logistics for the implementation of some key activities in the 2004-2005 TADDEI project in 2004, especially the M&E activities by the implementation of the Assembly.

Collecting data again, that some of the departments at the mid-term level delayed the report presentation process in a manner that the duration and timing used by the department for submission of the annual information was different from the Assembly's timeline.

Also, partners' interests were sometimes becoming a challenge as the targets given were not concerned with mutually acceptable levels. In most cases, the types of assessments were different.

Some improvements also related to implementation activities, particularly time for the preparation of the 2004 Annual Report concluding that the Assembly does not adequately attend to the issues and challenges from concerned firms.

Some of weak institutional structures, especially the Assembly and ministries, also influenced the timely preparation of the 2004 Annual progress report by institutions. Some institutions were very difficult to come by assessment of the relevant institution, and to them.

A limited understanding of how monitoring and evaluation are carried out also posed a challenge to the firms to meet DPPC institution to set up and the 2004 progress and framework.

CHAPTER TWO MONITORING AND EVALUATION ACTIVITIES REPORT

Summary

The chapter highlights some main achievements from the establishment and implementation of project and program registers, discussions of issues of relevance and experience sharing during the year. CEDEX budget analysis, project app analysis and the CEDEX budget Allocation and implementation of the Action plan. Measurement of performance by the local and rural institutions as well as the district-specific indicators were also reviewed to measure the level of performance of the various sectors of the local economy which are linked to the achievement of the medium-term development goals and the level of achievement of the sustainable development goals. Issues on culture development and poverty issues were also discussed as they played a crucial role in the realization of progress made during the year as far as improving the well-being of the people is concerned. Also discussed in this chapter are the issues relating to the rural strengths of the country, housing, property rights, and the ongoing survey results will be presented in this chapter.

Status of Projects and Progressions for 2014

A total of 102 activities were planned for the year 2014. Out of these, 129 were considered as completed. There were 10 cases with no Project outcomes or discontinuation of project. The per cent performance implementation completed and ongoing is 142% as of the end of the year 2014.

Table 2: summarizes the implementation of activities for 2014

The activities that were implemented have been categorized under the various sources of funding available to the Agency. These sources of funding are the District Assemblies Common Fund (DACF), and the District Assembly Common Fund Secretariats, Farms Fund (DAFF) DAFF, Other Indirect Government of Ghana (OIG), and the Locally Generated Fund (LGF) and others.

1.1.1.1 Project Register

A total of 202 new CDP projects were implemented during the year. 2014 under three CDP development dimensions which include: water management framework, Environment, Infrastructure, and Human Settlement and Governance, transparency and public accountability.

Details of the project register can be found in Table 4 below:

1.1.1.1.1 Land Development Dimensions

The third development dimension of the DPP/CDP/CDTDP has a goal of "Creating opportunities for all". A total of 10 physical projects with 347 activities were planned for the year 2014, and 23 of the physical projects were completed representing a 70% completion rate while 14 out of the 107 activities were also implemented representing 8% at the earliest level of completion and total of 49 years to reflect over. The Agency employed efficient planning and budgeting procedures and involved citizens during the implementation process to achieve success.

The activities completed largely include infrastructure enhancement such as the supply of basic services and rehabilitation of classroom blocks was a deliberate attempt certainly to enhance the delivery of education services and expand access, and procurement of quality education at all levels and eventually lead to the achievement of the sector goal in mind above. This will also help in the achievement of the sustainable development goals and targets 4.1, 4.2 and 4.3 in the SDG.

1.1.1.1.2 Health, Education, and Human Settlement Dimensions

The remaining percentages of health and social needs or the lowest measured of per cent the target for 2014. This is due to rapid urbanization of rural without any major rehabilitation or reconditioning works done. The Urban-Rural divide continue to struggle with other regions possibly due to the nature of the Federalization model implemented in the district. The publications under this indicates a significant effect on the achievement of the district's vision and mission and efficiency and effectiveness of rural transport infrastructure and services in the district. The table below further discusses the percentage of Federal Rural roads design constructed to enhance safety and security for all categories of road users. However, there is more need to be done in building the gap (see Appendix II).

1.1.1.1.3 Governance, Transparency and Public Accountability

The reported crime rates slightly declined below the national average category in 2013. Crime rates reported generally reflect no robbery, domestic violence and house breaking. However, the district did better in the regard by reducing crime to a few cases by holding the gay on the responsibility of police personnel and legislation for the security issues in the district. The effectiveness of the district in regards of enhancing security services delivery in the district was adversely affected by the performance of the members (see Appendix II).

1.1.1.4 Update on Critical Development and Poverty Issues

This section represents the various levels of interventions being undertaken by the District and the private Sector. Some initial development and poverty reduction interventions in health, education and general well-being continued to be implemented in the District in 2004. The implementation of the National Health Insurance Scheme, the School Feeding Programme and the Livelihood Improvement against Poverty (L.I.A.P) among other interventions being implemented in districts were also mentioned below is a snapshot of initial development and poverty issues that are being addressed in the District.

The Ministry has a total of 394 active projects at the DPPD 2014, and one DPPD project. The following broader areas of development were considered in planning Disaster preparedness, mitigation and public awareness. Emergency planning, and the implementation, monitoring, and evaluation framework dimensions did not have active projects as of the end of the year. Projects under these development dimensions have been completed. This implies efficient execution and a shift in priority towards the other development dimensions and the enforcement dimension.

Table 2 below, the number of ended projects from previous year and the ongoing active projects submitted in the years 2013, 2014, and 2015.

a. Social Development Initiatives

Social development assumed three levels of activities, with two (2) projects related to the first 2013 and no additional project assigned to 2014. The projects aim to assist the community involved in addressing the social needs of the people. These were DPPD NGO capacity projects which was acted by the Action Against Coordinating Council and DPMT committee for the implementation of activities by the different community. There were no activity or other three projects will be carried.

b. Environment, Infrastructure, and Finance Initiatives

In a bid to achieve the goal of "upgrading the natural infrastructure and ensuring sustainable habitation under the environment, infrastructure, and human settlement" the following financial assistance (PA) projects were comprised out of more than 300 planned activities for 2014 representing a 4.1% completion rate. These projects were implemented to help each of communities in how to address the natural environment including forestry, management of open lands, climate change and adaptation laws. High among others is that it will be added human settlement process to address a climate within the built environment. These would lead to the achievement of the main objective of protecting, preserving, planning, the disaster prevention and mitigation and eventually achieving the development dimension goal as stated above and link other sustainable development goals and targets of SDG 12.1, 12.2, and 12.3.

c. Governance, Corruption and Public Accountability

The development dimension received twenty-four (24) completed projects out of the total twenty-five (25) planned activities for 2014 representing an 80% completion rate. These were trying projects related to security, management, decentralized planning and budgeting, and the promotion of institutional assessment and assessment including evaluating the effectiveness of the municipal administration to promote decentralized local governance. These indicated environmental laws and the enhancement of the capacity to monitor the development dimension which will develop policies and assessments in decentralization at the local level and enhance security, service delivery and law that contributed to the achievement of the goal of "Promoting a Stable United and Safe Society for the citizen and promote the attainment of sustainable development goals and targets 11.1, 17.14, 17.17, 17.18 and 18.2 at the local level".

Emergency Planning and Preparedness Initiatives (DPPD-IP)

Emergency planning and preparedness development initiatives reported as 100% completion are in all three (3) sectors assessed for implementation for the year 2024. These activities cover disease mitigation and preparedness, climate, vaccination against COVID-19 and other pandemics, and support for emergency health management meetings. There are two main profiles due to the uniqueness of the importance of the diversity involving the health department and other agencies involved in managing disasters related to the issues of pandemic in the municipality. The success of this implementation led to the achievement of the objective of "National surveillance system and field response capacity to prevent, detect, monitor, and respond to a possible epidemic situation" under the development framework, and also contributed to the achievement of the development dimension's goal of "National Emergency planning and preparedness and Disaster Risk Reduction planning approach at all levels to respond to potential internal and external threats (including COVID-19)". The achievement of these objectives and goals helped achieve the sustainable development goals targets (i.e., SDG 3 and SDG 11).

11.1.5 Shortness of financial project among dimensions of the dimension

The project register for the Assembly has a total of 27 physical projects implemented in the year 2024. Out of these, two (2) projects were assessment projects for 2024 and therefore (2) have all set projects and are completed. But 19 out of these are active projects which plans are under way to complete them this year by the end of the year. Most of these projects were implemented by the works and 13 other projects carried in 2024. Most of the projects implemented by the works department were the finalization of investigations and recommendations and releasing of further trials and releases there were meant to strengthen evidence availability of goods and services and also improve the specialty orientation in the courts which were the priority within the department.

Table 4 gives details of the outcomes of projects by the Department of the Assembly in 2024.

Project Age Analysis

The analysis of the age of projects in the dataset revealed a total of 27 projects implemented in 2009 with new grants having either 1 to 4 years. There are no projects older than 1 year except for ten grants between 1 to 2 years. Table 7 also revealed that only two projects between the ages of 1 to 7 years have a significant time duration of 4 years and 2 months. The most recent grants of 2009 (n=46) all received the grants between the ages of 0 to 2 years old with 4 years being the maximum for the grants but the Ministry fail to mention the intention to handle to complete these delayed projects.

The average completion rate of 61 projects is 97.22% with the highest being 100% and the lowest 42% for 3- to 4-year-old projects indicating present project management. The table further revealed that those projects with complete audit reports had higher completion rates than those projects that are incomplete or have been in suspended status or not reported. This suggests that management has the responsibility of monitoring projects' outcome to complete all projects to time to avoid paying extra time for delayed projects.

1.3.1.1 Summary of Local Government and Development

The analysis of local government and development in implemented projects for 2007 revealed that the works department had the highest number of projects (37) representing a percentage performance of 13% followed by the Department of Education with 1 project. The mode of local assistance for almost all the projects were either implemented or pending local assist by public institution or proposed from the functional authority while other departments had clearly mentioned concerned units. This capability for local government assistance has been the recruitment of key efficient people. Thus ensured that the projects were implemented without any or minimal disruptions from efficient people. This also presented an effective, efficient and socially responsible project management strategy.

Progression Report

One hundred and thirty-four (134) progress actions were passed for implementation while one (1) development dimension including financial development 24, Social development 12, Technological advancement, and human resources 44, Governance, corruption, and public accountability 10, Emergency planning and preparedness (including 137/13-17), 5 not for implementation, continuous monitoring, and evaluation. 7

The analysis of the above items reveal that 137 actions were completed and 4 were in use or not implemented. Thus put the completed percentage rate at 94.2%.

Financial Development Dimension

The economic development dimension numbered 17 planned activities for the year and implemented 11 representing a percentage performance of 65%. Nine of these programs were money given to various collectors, agricultural were caption such as Small-Scale agriculture, and private sector operation (SSAO) as a tool to enhance their business environment and financial literacies. The successful completion of these programs can also in the commitment of the management of the

Assembly to increase revenue generation, especially the internally generated resources, and promote business development, environmental activities, and increased agriculture production for better living conditions for the people. These would help achieve the objectives of ensuring improved fiscal performance and sustainability, improved health development for the elderly, and diversification and expansion of the tourism industry for economic development and would contribute link to the enhancement of the sector goal of protecting job creation and decent work environment in the municipality. It will contribute also promote the enhancement of sustainable goals and targets; 17.1, 4.4, 13.1.1, and 2.5 in the system.

Social Development Initiatives

A total of 125-new (2) program activities were planned for the year 2024. Out of these 22.1 were not implemented or yet to start. This partly completion rate is 84%.

These have made possible due to the support received from the different partners, especially DILG, DOH, DSWD, and DA/DAU/DBER in supporting the efforts to implement most of the child laws, integrated social services, and other social protection programs including LGU, gender and vulnerability, DSSD for people living with disability, increasing of local capacities in finance, food safety, and education related activities. Issues of violence also received much attention during the year, and the issue of sexual issues by the enforcement of regulations of increasing the number and legal enforcement for child protection and development and the re-enforcement of domestic responsibility for local control and management. Other activities implemented under the social development dimension were related to health and education including training of teachers and promotion of students and their academic in the community including DILG-DHHR and nutrition program division, and implementation of DSWD/DBER related issues including vigorous campaign and orientation. These activities promoted the achievement of the sector goal of creating equal opportunities as reported in the 2023-2027 DA/DOH and sustainable development goals and targets; 5.1, 5.2, 13.14.2, 11.11.4, 1.4.2, 4.5, 4.6, and 17.7.

Environment, Biodiversity, and Climate Initiatives

In a bid to attain the goal of "upgrading the natural environment and securing a resilient 'no' environment under the government, administration, and human actions" development dimension, Environment (46) programs, were completed out of 50 total (46) planned activities for 2024 representing a 92% completion rate. These programs were concentrated in areas such as reforestation to aim to enhance the natural environment including forestry management of tree species, disease, disease and diagnosis areas. Major priority actions, going, raising, rehabilitation of State lands as well as activity human activities practice, to reduce pollution within the built environment. These would lead to the achievement of the sector objective of protecting, protecting, planning for climate resilience and mitigation and eventually enhancing the integrated dimension goal in areas such as being achieve sustainable development goal and targets of 12.2, 13.1, 13.2, and 13.3.

Resilience, Disaster and Public Accessibility

The development dimension reported from the 177 completed programs out of the total number 221 planned activities for 2024 representing a 80% completion rate. These focus largely

program related to security management, decentralized planning and budgeting, and the promotion of institutional management and entrepreneurship including enhancing the effectiveness of the municipal administration to promote sustainable local governance. These actions implemented have led to the achievement of the objective under the development dimension which is to develop political and administrative decentralization at the local level and enhance security service delivery and have also contributed to the achievement of the goal of "Promoting a Stable, Clean and Safe Society" by the center and promote the achievement of sustainable development goals and targets, (SDG 17.14, 17.17, 19.1 and 19.2) at the local level.

Emergency Planning and Preparedness including COVID-19

Emergency planning and preparedness development dimension, recorded a 100% completion rate for all three (3) activities assessed for implementation for the year 2021.

These activities cover disaster mitigation and emergency preparedness, emergency response (CRAZD-19 and other disasters), and support for emergency health management strategy. Success was contributed due to the commitment of the leadership of the Authority including the health department and other agencies involved in managing disasters attached to the issues of pandemic at the municipality.

The success of the implementation led to the achievement of the objective of "Ensured surveillance system and built response capacity to prevent, detect, contain, and respond to a possible pandemic outbreak" under this development dimension, and also contributed to the achievement of the development dimension's goal of "Enhancing Emergency planning and preparedness including COVID-19". The achievement of these objective and goals helped achieve the sustainable development goal categories, 17, 18, 19, and 21 at the local level.

Implementation, Coordination, Monitoring and Evaluation

Server 17 activities were planned and completed for the year, 2021. These were in the area of conducting RISK assessment, organization of public accountability forum, review of plan and budget, and other internal management tasks related to the growth and promotion of various delivery areas at the level. The success had enhanced the achievement of the objectives of this development dimension which is to "Develop the plan preparation, implementation and coordination and monitoring and evaluation at all levels" and has contributed to the achievement of the sector goal of improving the "Quality of development outcome at all levels" and helped attain the sustainable development goal and targets, 17.1, 17.14, 17.17, and 17.19 at the local level. Table 12 illustrates the details of the program regular; the level of implementation, risk, and success status provide for verification.

The average for the 14 active projects is 2 years and 4 months with an average time overrun of 1 year and 7 months. This is for the construction of Biblical churches which the original cost has been revised due to inflation, re-appropriations and inflationary cost. All other active projects have no revised final organization. This is because all these projects have been completed not waiting for their final payment. The total cost for all the active projects stand at C\$22 1,079,300.00 with C\$22 112,305.37 being expenditures paid to date leaving an outstanding balance of C\$22 1,764,744.22.

The church has no mechanism for project management or documentation. It is therefore recommended that project managers should be utilized to reduce cost overruns by reducing administrative cost, preventing unnecessary overtime, spending of resources, especially for high-budget projects like the roads and expanding income collection to finance these projects without relying on only 5000 bushels. This is recommendations are expected to reduce financial risks and losses in completing these projects in the future.
